A Message from Pastor Heather Sugden

In a year when nothing has been quite what we expected, maybe it is not surprising that All Saints Sunday falls on November 1st. Of course, All Saints is supposed to happen the day after Halloween, but we often celebrate it here in the Lutheran Church on whenever the first Sunday in November happens to occur. For those worried about late night Halloween antics disrupting our Sunday routine, don't fret – November 1st is also the end of Daylight Savings this year, meaning clocks will "fall back," and we will each receive the gift of an extra hour!

I find the gift of time fitting for an All Saints celebration. We have lost so much in 2020, including dear members of our congregation, community, and families. Our world came to a standstill and is still struggling with a virus that crosses all lines. Death, it seems, has been too much of a real presence in all of our lives. In the surreal setting of 2020, the gift of an extra hour on All Saints Sunday should give us all pause.

I spoke with a friend today who recently lost her mother. She said she felt like nothing was real right now: the shock of death was so disorienting she was too numb to even cry. But she did hold firmly to two truths: she missed her mother terribly, and she was so incredibly thankful for having her as a mother.

It might be hard to give thanks when our hearts are weighed down in grief. But that is what love does: it soars us to the highest heights; it shows the best of who we can be; it makes the pain of loss unbearable; it somehow pulls us on through life. Love binds us to all sorts of people, who feed us and talk to us and simply listen to us when we need them. Love, indeed, comes from God. Love never ends.

This All Saints Sunday, we will grieve together all whom we have lost. We will also give thanks together for the gift of life – so precious, so beautiful, and all too fragile. We will remind each other that God brings us together to hear news we declare good: that our Savior has died, is risen, and will come again. And through the love of God given for us, we all have life.
